Hearing Officer Any employee holding a position not exempted from the provisions of Article 34 Civil Service, and not in the initial probationary period, who has been suspended in excess of ten, (10) days, terminated, or demoted, may appeal to the Civil Service Commission within ten, (10) calendar days after notification in writing of such action. In the event of multiple suspensions, only that suspension which causes the total number of days suspended to exceed five, (5) days within a six month period, and any subsequent suspension within said period shall be appeal able to the Commission. If the disciplinary action is 10 days or less, the officer may submit to a grievance procedure or an internal appeal, but not to both.

The Statement of Charges was read aloud. Officer Montes advised that she understood the charges.

Officer Montes made a statement on her own behalf. Officer Montes advised that she did conduct a thorough search of the vehicle at the end of her shift. Additionally, she lost a shot gun shell in the area where the pistol was later located and if there had been a pistol there, she would have located it then when searching for the shell. She does not understand how she overlooked the pistol.

Shelton spoke on Officer Montes' behalf. He trained officer Montes during her 2-man FTO phase. Officer Montes is thorough in her vehicle inspections. It doesn't seem possible that the pistol was located as stated. Furthermore, its location is unclear from the memo generated.

Lt. Gardner spoke to the situation. He knows Officer Montes to be hardworking displaying experience beyond her time on the job. He has observed her conduct a vehicle safety inspection in the past and knows her to be thorough in this endeavor. The circumstances surrounding the finding of the gun seems suspect.

After reviewing the evidence and considering the statements made, I <u>Sustain the charge D.R. 101</u> Compliance with Regulations to wit Vehicle Safety Inspection.

At this point I reviewed the Disciplinary Chart of Officer I. Montes. There are no previous charges.

In summary, on 10/14/2021, Officer Montes and her partner completed their shift and turned in their vehicle's keys to the equipment officer. The squad car was inspected at the beginning of its next assignment and a loaded pistol was located in the backseat on the floorboard. Statements made during the hearing points toward some sort of malfeasance on the parts of the officers who located the pistol. There was no evidence offered as to why these officers would plant a pistol to blame officers from the previous shift. Officers are required to inspect their vehicle after anyone is placed in the back seat and again at the end of their shift. The importance of this task cannot be stressed enough. The consequences to this weapon being left in the back of the squad car are grave. The person originally in possession of this weapon was likely doing so unlawfully and the weapon might have been evidence of a more serious crime he had committed. Also, the next person placed in the rear of that squad car might have had different intentions upon locating the weapon.

After <u>sustaining the charge</u> against Officer Montes and reviewing her disciplinary resume, I order that she receive a 1-Day Suspension to be taken on February 19th.

This memo is regarding a weapon that was found in patrol unit On 10/14/2021 bravo shift Officer's were assigned patrol unit P and found a Smith & Wesson 9mm handgun underneath the driver seat.

On 10/13/2021 at approximately 2105 hours, Officer R. Perez 13693 and Officer I. Montes 14842 made the scene of a carjacking. During the investigation, Officer's detained a male Hispanic. Officer's placed handcuffs on the individual and conducted a pat down of the individual for weapons. Officer's observed that the detainee had tight clothing which included his jeans, and long sleeve shirt. While the detainee was handcuffed and in the backseat of the patrol unit, Officers were standing next to the squad car conducting their investigation. Officers observed the detainee for most of the time that he was in the backseat of the patrol car. Due to Officer's thorough pat down of the detainees tight clothing, and the observation of the detainee while in the patrol car, Officer Perez is led to believe that the detainee did not possess any type of firearm. Officer I. Montes searched the patrol car in detail prior to the start of the Officers shift and did not observe any weapons in the vehicle.

Further, Officer's released the detainee and checked the back seat of their patrol car and did not observe any weapons or contraband in the backseat. During the encounter, Officer R. Perez engaged his body worn camera with his fingers and was under the impression that his body worn camera was turned on. After Officer's released the detainee, Officer Perez realized that his body worn camera was off.

On 10/13/2021 at 1630hrs I came to work, got dressed and at 1645hrs I loaded up and conducted a thoroughly search in the front and back seat of the car making sure there wasn't anything left in the car from the previous shift. I then got ready for roll call at 1655hrs.

After roll call Officer R.Perez loaded up his equipment as I got my shot gun car ready and then one of my shot gun shells fell underneath of the driver seat and I looked underneath the driver seat to get my shot gun shell and did not locate any firearm underneath the driver seat but did locate my shot gun shell.

We then went to IAB for Officer R.Perez and stayed there till 2104hrs. We then were dispatched to a carjacking at at 2105 hrs. Officer R. Perez and I were advised that the complainant who called for police might be the suspect who fled a scene of an accident that occurred at 1949hrs. We then proceeded to take a report and after gathering our information, we detained and I conducted a thorough pat down on detainee by patting down the outter surface of his clothing in an attempt to find a weapon and also checked the inside of the boots with Officer Merill(14494) on standby. After patting him down we put him in the back sit of P Officer R. Perez then raised Lieutenant B. Brown to advise us on what to do with the detainee. Lieutenant B. Brown advised to let detainee go and finish the report. I then took out of the back seat of P ⁷ and released him.

I then realized I forgot to turn on the in car video surveillance for the back seat but it was to late.

We then left the scene and conducted other calls till 0020 when we showed our way back to the precinct to do FTO paper work. Officer R.Perez unloaded his equipment down first and then I unloaded mine. Then I parked P in the parking lot and stayed to update my log sheet and conduct end of shift search of the vehicle to make sure my partner and I did not forget our ward books or Narcan equipment along with checking the back seat area of the car while Officer R. Perez went inside to do FTO paperwork.
