Humphrey's School of Law, where she later served as a member of the Law Alumni, University Foundation Board of Directors, and as an Adjunct Faculty Member; she received a Master's of Law degree from Duke University School of Law, and an Honorary Doctorate from Suffolk University; she frequently serves as faculty for the Federal Judicial Center, the Berkeley Judicial Institute, various international judicial programs spanning more than twenty-five countries, the National Judicial College, where she currently serves as the Cabelli Distinguished Jurist in Residence for Rule of Law; and

WHEREAS, Judge Donald currently serves on the Board of Directors for the Appellate Judges Education Institute and is a member of the prestigious American Law Institute; in addition, she serves as the Chair of the National Bar Association's Judicial Council Education Committee and has received the Judicial Council's President and Chair Awards, along with other special service awards; she has served as President of the National Association of Women Judges and the Association of Women Attorneys, fostering collaboration with other judicial organizations and significantly increasing members and revenues; and

WHEREAS, Judge Donald is currently a Member of the preeminent law firm of Burch, Porter & Johnson, PLLC in Memphis, Tennessee, where she provides arbitration, mediation, appellate advisory, moot court, and mock trial services; and

WHEREAS, Judge Donald is an internationally recognized legal scholar who has lectured and trained judges around the world in areas of intellectual property, case management, bankruptcy law, judicial ethics, and alternative dispute resolution; and

WHEREAS, Judge Donald has received over 100 awards for professional, civic, and community activities, including the Pillars of Excellence Award, the Sandra Day O'Connor Award, the Distinguished Alumni Award from the University of Memphis, the Martin Luther King Community Service Award, and the Benjamin Hooks Award presented by the Memphis Bar Foundation; in 2020, the American Bar Association Labor and Employment Law Section successfully petitioned the ABA Board of Governors to create the "Judge Bernice B. Donald Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Award", with Judge Donald as the inaugural recipient; and

WHEREAS, Judge Donald has been married to W.L. "Don" Donald for 51 years and enjoys the support of her close-knit family, friends and community.
