# **EDGE COMMUNITY BUILDER PILOT** (PAYMENT-IN-LIEU-OF-TAXES) PROGRAM

- Markets Tax Credit Census Tracts in Memphis and Shelby County construction costs and 15% of PILOT savings
- Focuses on investment in distressed neighborhoods within New Provides a 10-year, 75% tax abatement, covering 25% of Targets projects that align with broader goals of community
- development and economic revitalization in historically underserved areas
- Does not set specific requirements for capital investment or job creation, prioritizing neighborhood revitalization instead






# 2011-2023 Diversity Spend

### Spending with Certified Women, Minority, and Local Companies









- Plain Language Description: The annual fee is for the funding of the Memphis & Shelby County Health Department, Pollution Control, Ground Water Quality Control Program via the assessment of a per meter connection rate (\$0.55 per meter) for each municipality in Shelby County: Bartlett • Collierville • Germantown • Millington •MLGW
- Impact: This program supports: A comprehensive program to prevent ground water contamination through permitting of wells. A comprehensive and expanding program of sampling and monitoring of all existing wells. A compilation and maintenance of an inventory of all existing and abandoned wells. A comprehensive and vigorous enforcement program of all relevant ordinances and regulations. Water Well Permitting Any person in Shelby County requesting the installation, modification, repair, or abandonment of a water well or any other type well shall make an application to the Water Quality
   Branch and Septic Tank Program. The Health Department provides oversight and guidance for the Shelby County Ground Water Quality Control Board.

### Identity Manager Support (IDM)

- Plain Language Description: This contract extension and ratification is to allow third-party support via Consensus Technologies in helping MLGW with projects, upgrades, system management, and ad hoc support on our Novell and Identity Manager systems. Novell and Identity Manager allow all MLGW users to log onto their computers with their company user ID or A00XXXX numbers.
- Impact: The contract extension allows the vendor to continue to work with MLGW's Operating System team to support the Novell and Identity Manager systems used to provide login access from their workstations to the MLGW applications (Customer Information Systems, Oracle
   Finance/HR/Asset Management applications, etc.).



- LSB/MWBE Goal Assigned/Committed: There is no Supplier Diversity goal assigned to this contract; however, the actual participation is 100% WBE.
- Plain Language Description: Splunk is a software that collects data from websites, apps, and devices and turns it into easy charts and reports. It helps find problems and shows what's happening with your technology.
- Impact: Without the Splunk software, it is harder to find problems, track systems, or spot cybersecurity issues. It takes longer to understand what is going on because the data is not organized.

### **65-foot Gray Steel Poles**

- Funded amount: \$525,000.00
- Award Duration: N/A
- Type of Bid: Sealed Bid
- Awarded to: After the RFQ closes on January 14th, bids will be evaluated, and an award will be made to the most responsive bidder.
- LSB/MWBE Goal Assigned/Committed: Will be determined at the time of bid evaluation.
- Plain Language Description: This purchase is for 23, 65-foot gray steel poles that will be used to support the electric conductors and equipment required to provide service to customers.
- Impact: The poles will provide power to 485 planned subdivision lots in the surrounding area of Old Brownsville Road and Seedtick Road. They will also increase the reliability of the Lakeland Schools and Sewer Treatment Station along Old Brownsville Road. The work related to these poles is reimbursable by the customer.

- Awarded to: Universal Scaffold and Equipment







- Plain Language Description: To provide underground electric service for new and existing customers and to replenish inventory to ensure we have adequate material to meet demand for upcoming projects and scheduled maintenance. This involves six types of cable and up to 271,000 feet.
- Impact: The need exists to ensure adequate underground cable exists for reliable customer service.

### Water, Gas, Booster and Vacant Lots Grounds Maintenance

- Funded amount: \$338,543.28
- Award Duration: August 7, 2024 through December 31, 2025
- Type of Bid: Sealed Bid
- Awarded to: Rotolo Consultants, LLC
- LSB/MWBE Goal Assigned/Committed: Yes, a 20% Supplier Diversity goal was assigned.
- Plain Language Description: This contract is for grounds maintenance for MLGW's Water, Gas, booster and vacant lot facilities. The services include spraying, trimming, limb removal, weed control, fence clearing, mowing etc. improving and maintaining the overall aesthetics of the facilities.
- Impact: MLGW needs to be able to upkeep and improve the referenced properties grounds areas overall aesthetics.

### Medium Voltage EPR Cable

- Funded amount: \$10,000,000.00
- Award Duration: Second, twelve-month extension expiring February 20, 2026
- Type of Bid: Sealed Bid
- Awarded to: Universal Scaffold & Equipment





- LSB/MWBE Goal Assigned/Committed: There is no Supplier Diversity goal assigned. However, the actual participation is 100% MBE & LSB.
- Plain Language Description: To provide underground electric service for new and existing customers, supply cable for upcoming jobs and to replenish inventory to ensure we have adequate material to meet demand for upcoming projects and scheduled maintenance. This involves eight types of cable and up to 667,000 feet.
- Impact: The need exists to ensure we have underground cable to provide reliable service. The #2 and 750 EPR cables are also needed for the Infrastructure Renewal and Replacement project which was formerly the MLGW Way Forward. The goal is to replace 98,000 feet of #2 and 750 EPR cable per year.




Whereas there are no further anticipated uses for the subject parcel; and
