

The Memphis Police Department (MPD) seeks funding through the BJA FY23 Body-worn Camera Policy and Implementation Program to Support Law Enforcement Agencies. MPD's proposed project aims to equip 2,200 sworn officers with BWCs and establish a comprehensive BWC program to enhance transparency and accountability in policing. The program will include policies and procedures for BWC activation, video management, privacy protections, officer training, and community outreach. The project will also establish performance measures to assess the impact of the BWC program on officer behavior, citizen complaints, and public trust. MPD's project will help strengthen the department's commitment to constitutional policing and build stronger relationships with the communities it serves. Additionally, MPD will seek TTA from BJA to strengthen its policies, procedures, and practices regarding utilization of its BWC program in the furtherance of priority areas of focus, to include the following: investigations of deaths of individuals while in custody, recruiting and retaining diverse and service-oriented law enforcement professionals, collecting and reporting use of force and misconduct data, improving community and law enforcement dialogue, responding to individuals in mental health crisis or with disabilities, the proper and responsible use of technology, restrictions on unannounced entries and certain restraints, addressing implicit bias, restricting the use of militarized equipment, broader criminal justice reform, and officer wellness and mental health.

The contract award was based on the lowest and best bid using the sealed bid process.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of Light, Gas and Water Commissioners in their meeting of December 20, 2023 approved Change No. 3 to Contract No. 12202, Network Maintenance with ConvergeOne, Inc. to renew and change the current contract in the funded amount of \$1,110,072.11, and is now recommending to the Council of the City of Memphis that it approves said renewal and change as approved; and

WHEREAS, the project scope is to provide maintenance and support services for MLGW's corporate computer network at various MLGW locations. The maintenance and support services are utilized to support the corporate network bandwidth connections with MLGW's internet service providers and provide protection against major web attacks. The contract award was based on the lowest and best bid using the sealed bid process; and

WHEREAS, this change is to renew the current contract for the third of four (4) annual renewal terms for the period covering February 15, 2024 through February 14, 2025 in the amount of \$1,110,072.11, which reflects a 46.2% decrease in rates from the previous year. The decrease is due to the removal of Cisco items covered under SmartNet and items which do not require monitoring under the network monitoring service, OnGuard. This change also includes the addition of maintenance and support services for new equipment which was added during this term. This renewal and change complies with all applicable laws and policies. The new contract value is \$6,436,489.52; and

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE II, SECTION 2-19 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MEMPHIS, TO CREATE HEALTH BENEFITS FOR ELECTED OFFICIALS.

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted Ordinance 5219, establishing the authority of the Council to create, appoint, and regulate City Council Staff; and

WHEREAS, Article 27, Section 190.1 of the Charter of the City of Memphis, gives the City Council the authority by Ordinance to create a hospitalization plan for officers and employees of the City of Memphis; and

WHEREAS, the Council has determined that the creation of a broader hospitalization plan for elected officials should be implemented; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to this established authority, the City Council desires to create a program to provide health benefits for elected officials in the legislative division.

SECTION 1. NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF MEMPHIS that the Code of Ordinances for the City of Memphis, Tennessee Chapter 2, Article II, Section 2-19, is hereby amended by adding a new section with the following language, which shall read as follows:

Section 2-19. – Council Staff Positions

- (f) The Director of Personnel shall create a program and structure to provide medical, vision, dental, and other health benefits to Elected Officials in the Legislative Division upon completion of two full terms in office:
 - a. The Director of Personnel shall determine how the program will be administered to provide the same medical, vision, and dental benefits afforded city employees under the mayor's jurisdiction for all qualified elected officials dating back to January 1, 2015.
 - b. Qualified Elected Officials will be required to submit financial contributions equal to that of city employees under the mayor's jurisdiction for medical dental, and vision benefits to maintain coverage.
 - c. Elected officials who leave office before completing two full terms or elected officials who are removed from office for malfeasance or misconduct will not be included.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MEMPHIS that the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby severable. If any of these sections, provisions, sentences, clauses, phrases, or parts are held unconstitutional or void, the remainder of this Ordinance shall continue in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MEMPHIS that this Ordinance shall take effect from and after the date it shall have been passed by the Council, signed by the Chairman of the Council, certified and delivered to the Office of the Mayor in writing by the Comptroller, and become effective as otherwise provided by law.

RESOLUTION TO CREATE A CITY OF MEMPHIS FLEET TASK FORCE TO PROVIDE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE DIVISION OF GENERAL SERVICES AND CITY COUNCIL FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF BEST PRACTICES FOR THE MAINTENANCE AND PROCUREMENT OF THE CITY OF MEMPHIS' FLEET

WHEREAS, the Memphis City Council recognizes the need for improvements in the way the City of Memphis maintains and procures its fleet; and

WHEREAS, the City of Memphis' fleet provides the means for officers to patrol our city and keep individuals safe, and for other divisions to provide vital services to our communities; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Memphis City Council that the processes for maintenance and procurement of fleet be improved and implemented to ensure that the City of Memphis may continue to operate and provide services in an efficient and effective manner; in order for such improvements to take place, the Council would like to receive recommendations from key stakeholders on the issue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Memphis City Council, committed to improving the quality of the current fleet and the City's ability to adequately and effectively procure additional fleet when necessary, hereby establishes a City of Memphis Fleet Task Force to provide recommendations to the Division of General Services and the Memphis City Council for implementation of best practices for procuring and maintaining fleet owned and operated by the City of Memphis.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Fleet Task Force shall consist of (i) two self-nominated City Council members, (ii) the City's Director of General Services or their designee, (iii) a representative from the City of Memphis Office of Fleet Management, (iv) a representative from the City of Memphis Chief Operating Officer's Office, (v) the City's Director of Police Services or their designee, (vi) the City's Director of Fire Services or their designee, and (vii) the City's Chief Financial Officer or their designee.

Ad Hoc Committee assignments and details are as follows:

- (1) At the first meeting, the Task Force shall elect a Chair and Vice Chair.
- (2) Meetings of the Task Force shall be subject to the open meetings provisions of T.C.A. Title 8, Chapter 44.
- (3) The Task Force Shall meet monthly for six (6) months.
- (4) The Task Force shall identify and address opportunities for improvement and implementation of current City efforts to procure and maintain the City of Memphis' fleet.
- (5) At the conclusion of six (6) months, the Fleet Task Force will share their recommendations to the Memphis City Council Public Works Committee.
