Resolution approving the ratification of purchase order number 7009932 to Howard Industries, Inc., for single phase pole type distribution transformers for an additional amount of \$224,318.64.

2. Additional Information

On October 3, 2018, the Board of Light, Gas and Water Commissioners approved a sixty-month blanket purchase order for the purchase of single-phase pole type distribution transformers in the amount of \$8,607,128.03. The recommendation taken to the Board was to award a percentage of the pole type distribution transformers to Howard Industries, in the amount of \$5,960,038.36 and Utility Sales Agency DBA ERMCO in the amount of \$2,647,089.67. The single-phase pole type distribution transformers are needed to provide electric service to residential customers. ERMCO sent a letter via certified mail in August 2022, that effective in 2023, they would cancel their contract and no longer furnish MLGW with transformers. An amount of \$1,551,241.00 was spent with ERMCO for transformers which leaves a balance of \$1,095,848.67. Due to the cancellation of the ERMCO contract, Howard had to furnish more transformers than initially anticipated, which resulted in an overage of \$224,318.64. We are seeking approval to ratify the transfer of the remaining balance of \$1,095,848.67 from ERMCO to Howard Industries purchase order number 7009932.

WHEREAS, the Board of Light, Gas and Water Commissioners in their meeting of February 7, 2024 approved ratification of purchase order number 7009932 for single phase pole type distribution transformers and is now recommending to the Council of the City of Memphis that it approves said ratification as approved in the 2024 fiscal year budget; and

WHEREAS, on October 3, 2018, the Board of Light, Gas and Water Commissioners approved a sixty-month blanket purchase order for the purchase of single-phase pole type distribution transformers in the amount of \$8,607,128.03. The recommendation taken to the Board was to award a percentage of the pole type distribution transformers to Howard Industries, in the amount of \$5,960,038.36 and Utility Sales Agency DBA ERMCO in the amount of \$2,647,089.67. The single-phase pole type distribution transformers are needed to provide electric service to residential customers. ERMCO sent a letter via certified mail in August 2022, that effective in 2023, they would cancel their contract and no longer furnish MLGW with transformers. An amount of \$1,551,241.00 was spent with ERMCO for transformers which leaves a balance of \$1,095,848.67. Due to the cancellation of the ERMCO contract, Howard had to furnish more transformers than we initially anticipated, which resulted in an overage of \$224,318.64. We are seeking approval to ratify the transfer of the remaining balance of \$1,095,848.67 from ERMCO to Howard Industries purchase order number 7009932. The transformer industry has experienced unprecedented increases mainly due to higher raw material demand, production backlogs, and labor constraints. All existing terms and conditions will remain the same. This ratification complies with all applicable laws and policies.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE II, SECTION 2-19 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MEMPHIS, TO CREATE HEALTH BENEFITS FOR ELECTED OFFICIALS.

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted Ordinance 5219, establishing the authority of the Council to create, appoint, and regulate City Council Staff; and

WHEREAS, Article 27, Section 190.1 of the Charter of the City of Memphis, gives the City Council the authority by Ordinance to create a hospitalization plan for officers and employees of the City of Memphis; and

WHEREAS, the Council has determined that the creation of a broader hospitalization plan for elected officials should be implemented; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to this established authority, the City Council desires to create a program to provide health benefits for elected officials in the legislative division.

SECTION 1. NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF MEMPHIS that the Code of Ordinances for the City of Memphis, Tennessee Chapter 2, Article II, Section 2-19, is hereby amended by adding a new section with the following language, which shall read as follows:

Section 2-19. – Council Staff Positions

- (f) The Director of Personnel shall create a program and structure to provide medical, vision, dental, and other health benefits to Elected Officials in the Legislative Division upon completion of two full terms in office:
 - a. The Director of Personnel shall determine how the program will be administered to provide the same medical, vision, and dental benefits afforded city employees under the mayor's jurisdiction for all qualified elected officials dating back to January 1, 2015.
 - b. Qualified Elected Officials will be required to submit financial contributions equal to that of city employees under the mayor's jurisdiction for medical dental, and vision benefits to maintain coverage.
 - c. Elected officials who leave office before completing two full terms or elected officials who are removed from office for malfeasance or misconduct will not be included.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MEMPHIS that the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby severable. If any of these sections, provisions, sentences, clauses, phrases, or parts are held unconstitutional or void, the remainder of this Ordinance shall continue in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MEMPHIS that this Ordinance shall take effect from and after the date it shall have been passed by the Council, signed by the Chairman of the Council, certified and delivered to the Office of the Mayor in writing by the Comptroller, and become effective as otherwise provided by law.
