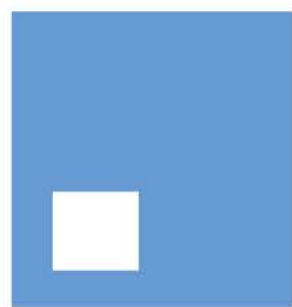

Overall Crime Historic Reduction



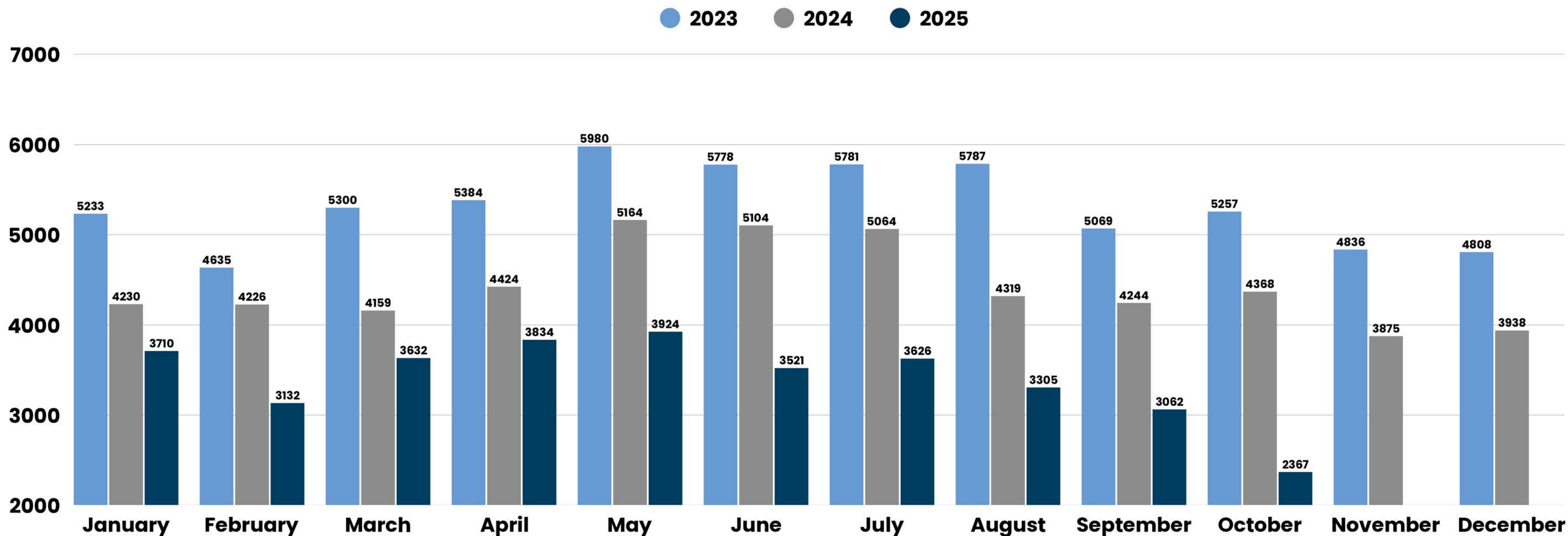

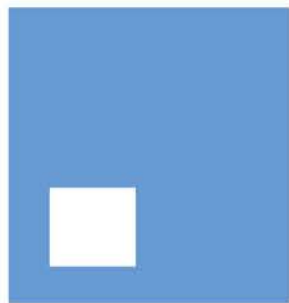
Part I Crime Overview

This three-year comparison of Part 1 crimes proves that focused strategies, technology, and collaboration are making a measurable difference in our communities.



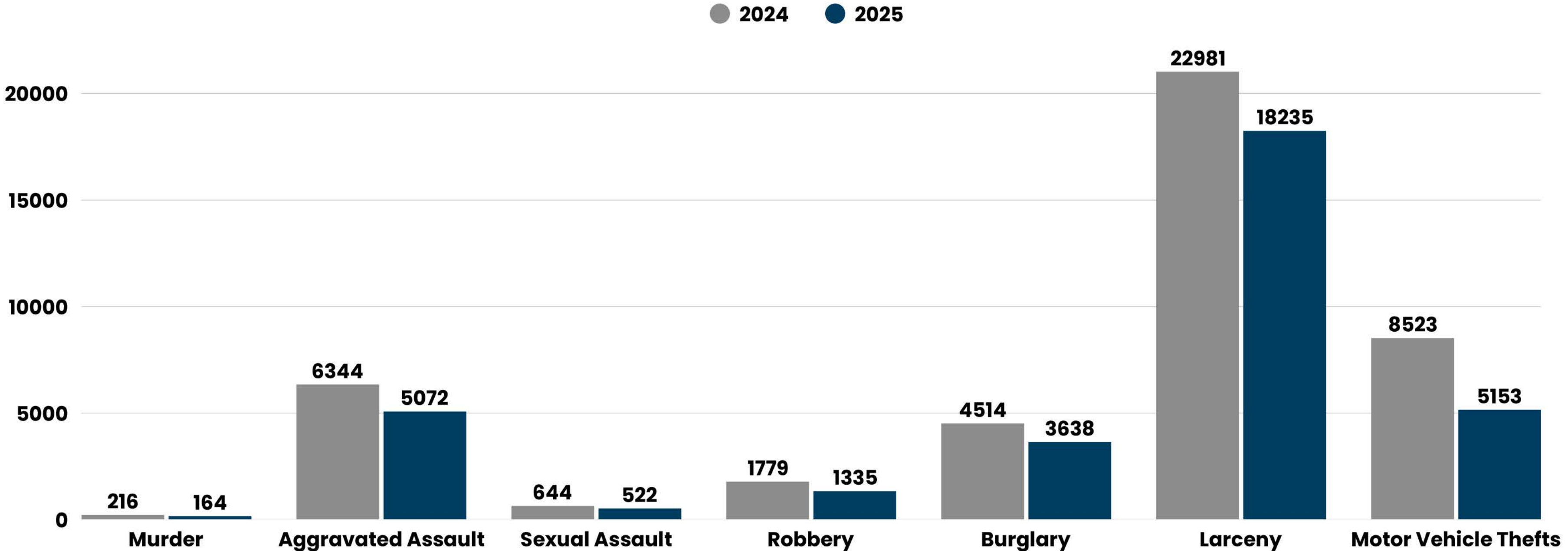

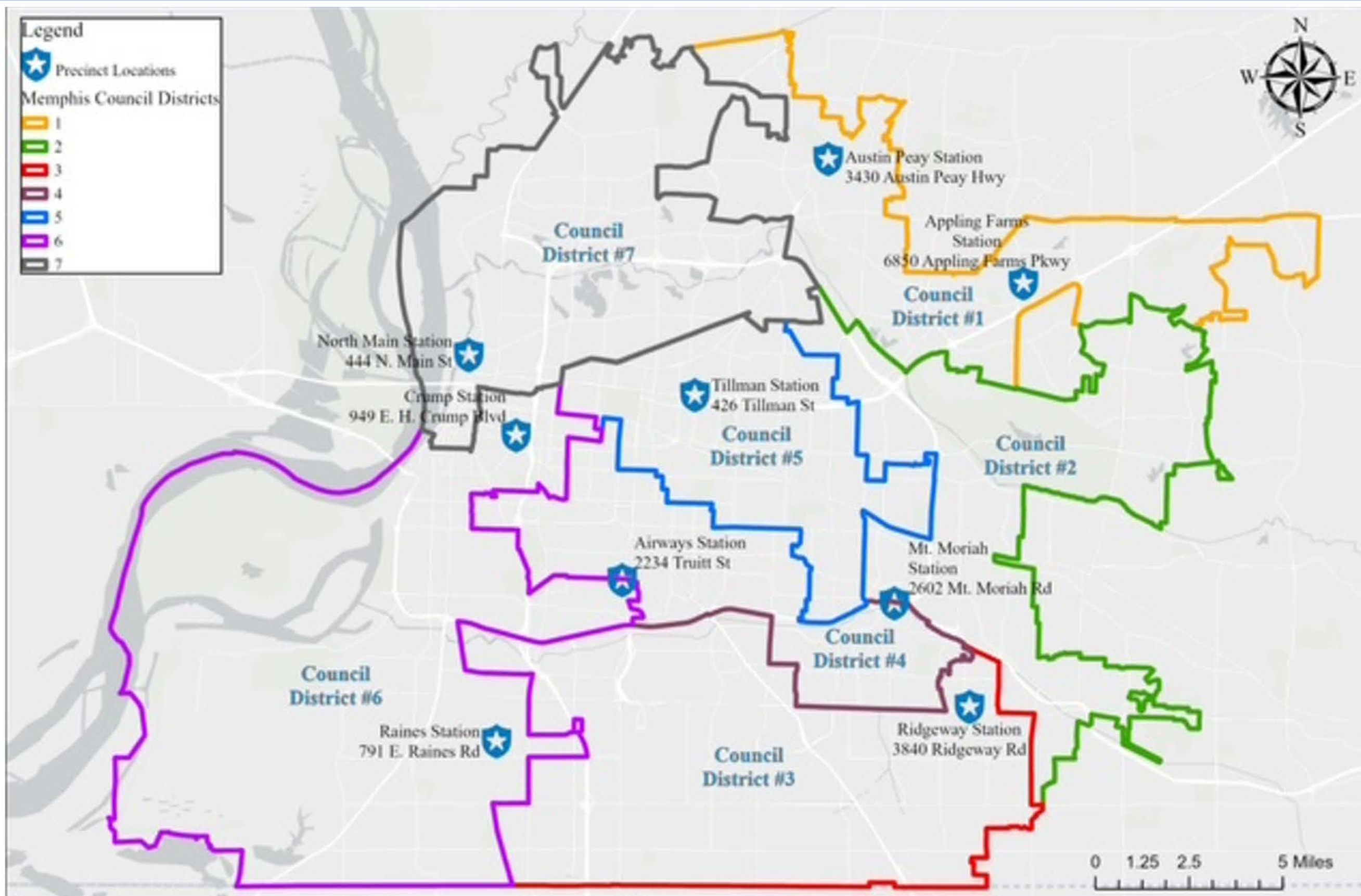
Year-to-Date Comparison

Across Memphis, every major crime category is down.



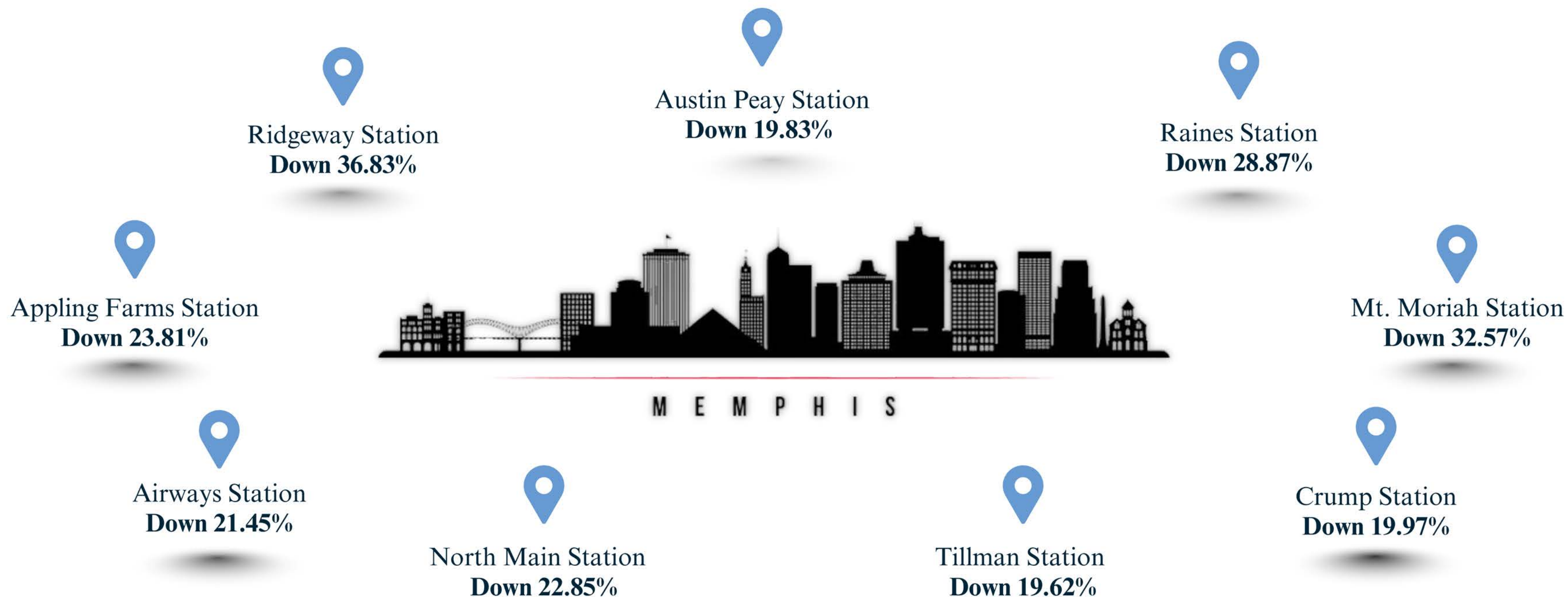

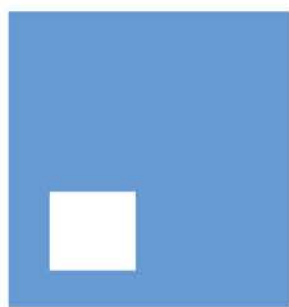
MPD Coverage by Council District



Citywide Crime Declines by Precinct

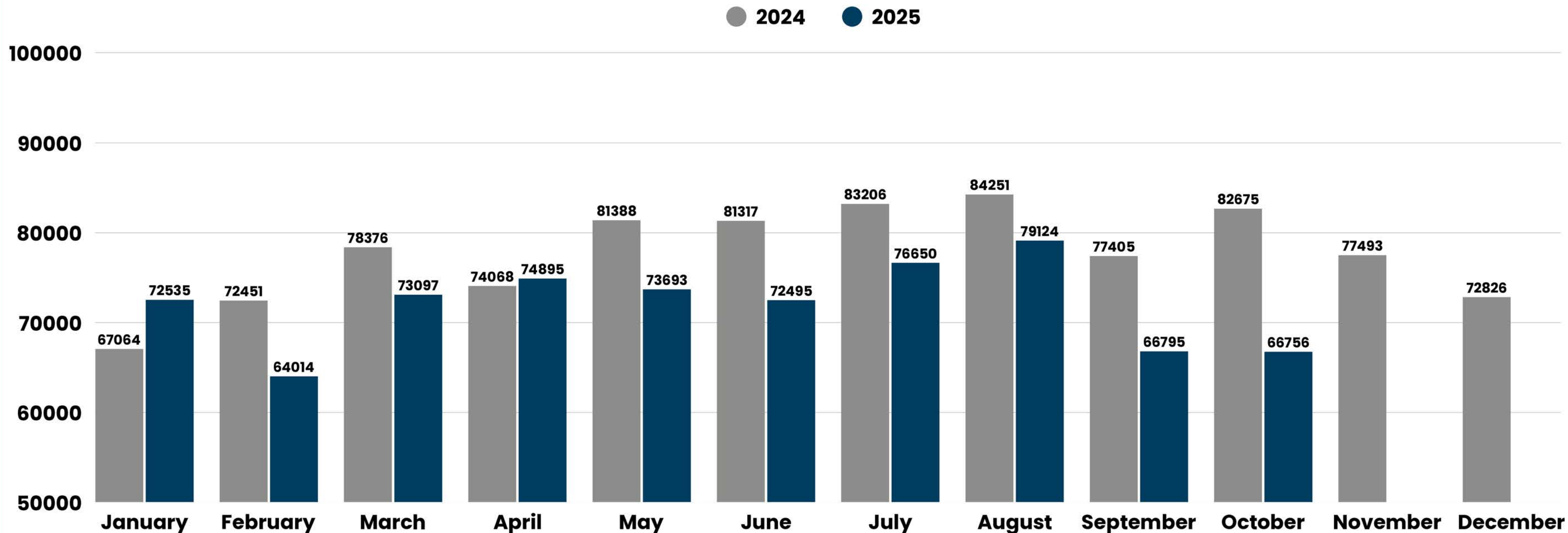
Part 1 Crime Reduction Measured YTD

Overtime Expenditures

Overtime Analysis for October 2024/2025 Month-to-Date



As of October in **FY25 (2024)**, the department recorded **\$3,576,801.51** in overtime expenditures. In comparison, during the same period in **FY26 (2025)**, total overtime spending was **\$2,633,706.09**. An additional **\$446,286** from FY26 is pending reimbursement, which will further reduce the department's overall overtime costs. This data reflects a notable decrease in overtime spending year-over-year, demonstrating progress toward improved fiscal management and operational efficiency.

RECRUITMENT

WITH STATE-OF-THE-ART TECHNOLOGY AND SPACIOUS FACILITIES, THE MPD TRAINING ACADEMY IS EQUIPPED TO TRAIN LARGE CLASSES OF RECRUITS, BUILDING THE NEXT GENERATION OF MEMPHIS OFFICERS.

MPD focuses on retention in a number of ways, including advanced training, career opportunities, and access to improved equipment and technology. As of November 10, 2025, MPD has 1,902 sworn officers, leaving the department 598 positions short of its full complement of 2,500 officers.

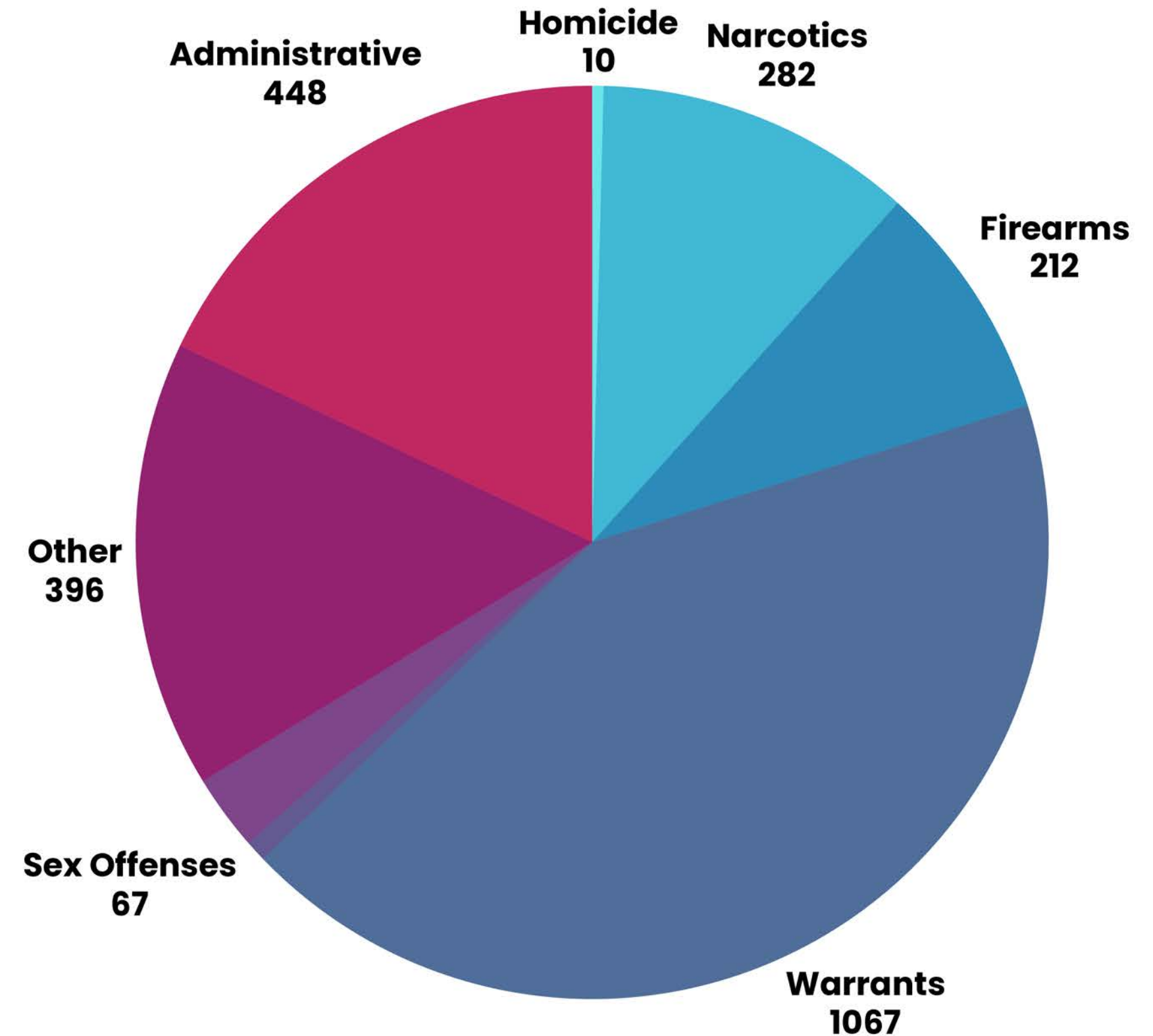
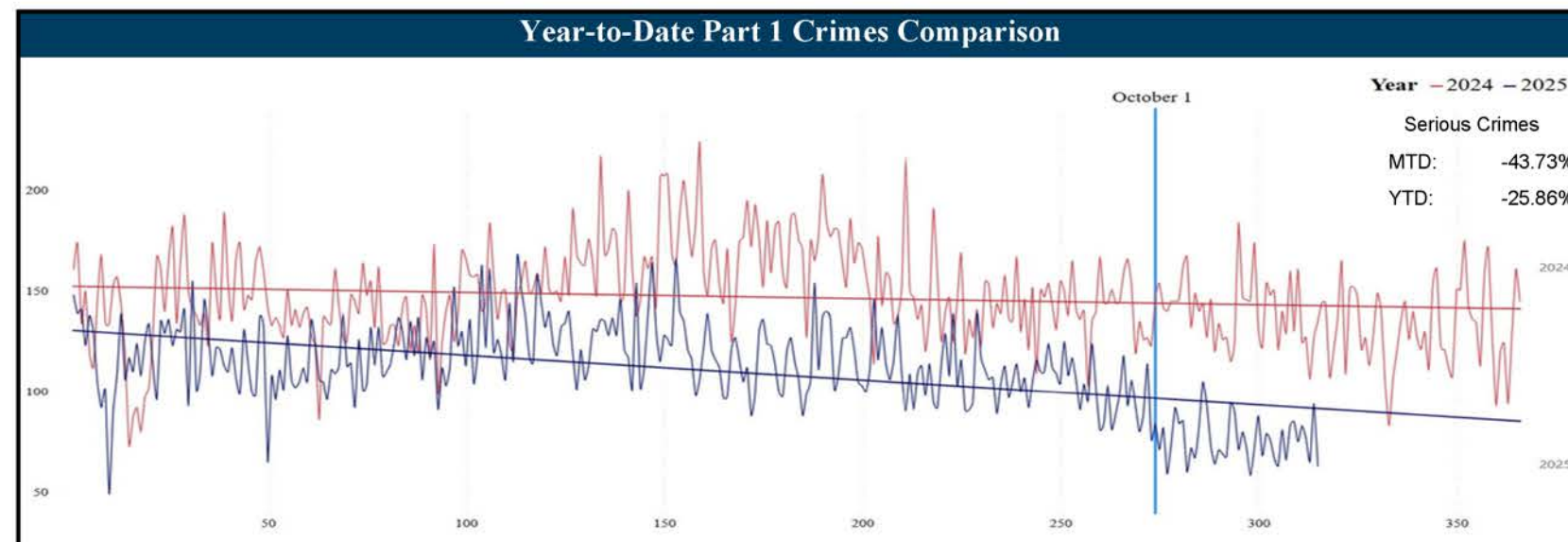
The Memphis Safe Task Force is a joint effort involving more than 20 local, state, and federal agencies. Since September 29th, our federal partners have been actively deployed, supporting MPD's leadership in violent crime initiatives as well as other critical public safety and quality-of-life efforts, including fugitive warrants, interstate traffic enforcement, property crime prevention, and more. MPD's focus has not changed, and we will continue building on the progress already made to keep Memphis safer.

MEMPHIS SAFE TASK FORCE

As of November 11, 2025 the Memphis Safe Task Force has made **2,506 arrests** and **seized 412 firearms**. These results show that the task force is not just active but highly effective, serving as a strong deterrent and a valuable resource for our city.

- 293 Known Gang Members Arrested
- 54 Juvenile Arrests
- 8,272 Traffic Citations Issued
- 40 Search Warrants Executed
- 148 Misdemeanor Citations Issued

Across 31 agencies, a total of **1,748 personnel** have supported and assisted in this operation.



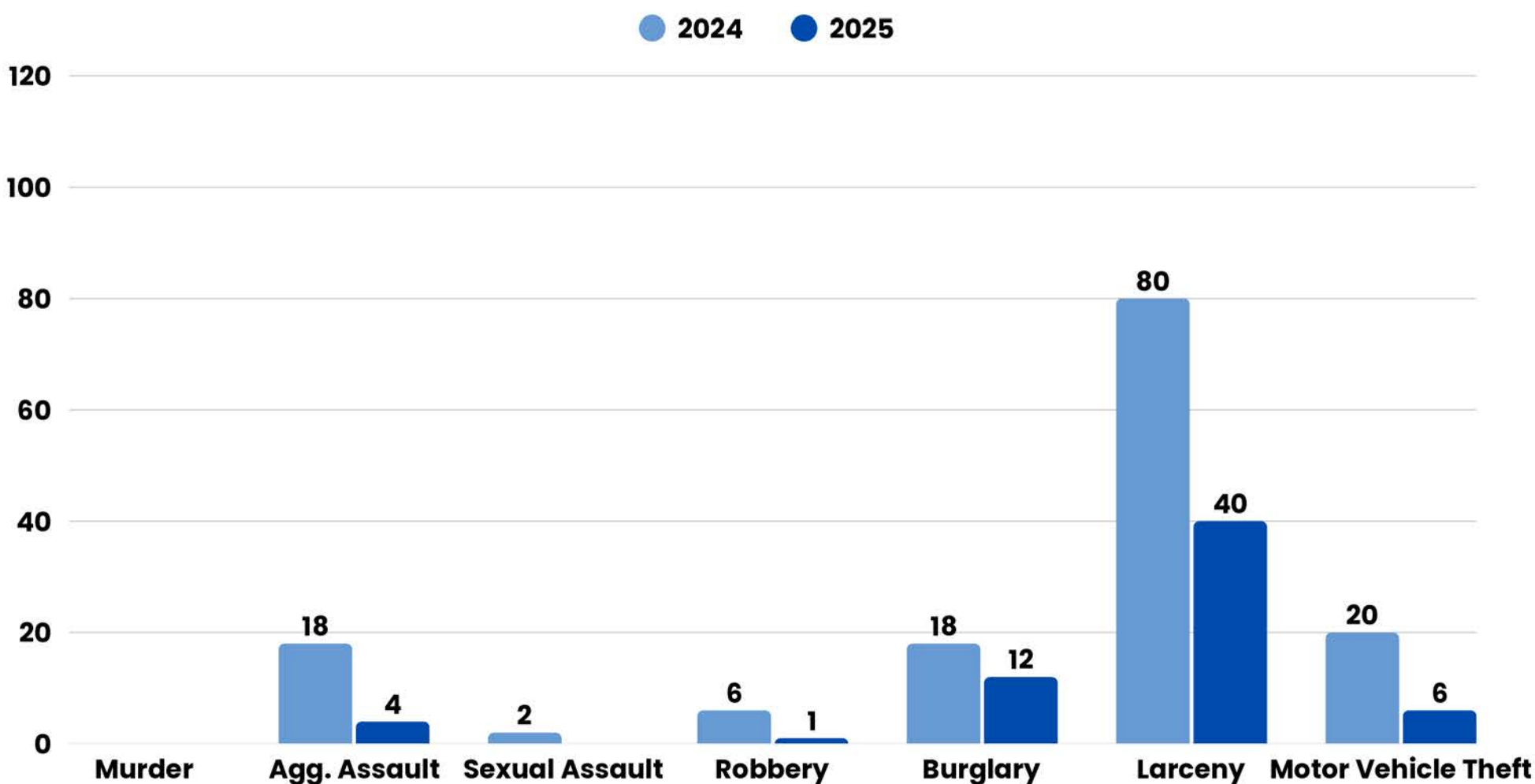
SNAPSHOT: NOV. 11, 2025

A look into the daily operations of the Memphis Safe Task Force shows the continued impact of this initiative. On November 11, 2025, the task force made 72 arrests and cleared two violent warrants.

- 20 Felony Arrests
- 36 Misdemeanor Arrests
- 30 Gang Members Arrested w/ Warrants
- 14 Misdemeanor Citations Issued
- 2 Juvenile Summons Issued
- 4 Missing Children Located
- 522 Traffic Citations Issued
- 3 Firearms Seized
- 2 Vehicles Recovered
